Substitute Senate Bill No. 1206

Senate, March 26, 2007

The Committee on Energy and Technology reported through SEN. FONFARA, J. of the 1st Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the Senate, that the substitute bill ought to pass.

AN ACT CONCERNING NATURAL GAS CUSTOMER CHOICE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- 1 Section 1. (*Effective from passage*) Not later than July 1, 2007, the
2 Department of Public Utility Control shall initiate a contested case
3 proceeding in accordance with the provisions of chapter 54 of the
4 general statutes to evaluate residential natural gas choice. Said
5 proceeding shall include, but not be limited to, a consideration of (1)
6 customer billing and enrollment procedures, (2) purchase of customer
7 receivables, (3) assignment of capacity, and (4) operational balancing
8 rules for residential gas customers.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
