**AN ACT CONCERNING PUBLIC INSTITUTION OF HIGHER
EDUCATION SYSTEM TRANSFER AND ARTICULATION
AGREEMENTS.**

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General
Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (*Effective July 1, 2007*) The Department of Higher
2 Education, in consultation with the constituent units of state system of
3 higher education, shall review the status and content of public
4 institution of higher education system transfer and articulation
5 agreements. Such review shall consider: (1) The sufficiency of these
6 agreements or agreements modified or made on or after July 1, 2007,
7 (A) to ensure appropriate credit transfer against degree requirements
8 within each constituent unit, and (B) to ensure appropriate credit
9 transfer against degree requirements across the constituents units and
10 whether there are disparities between the transfer of credits from the
11 same or similar program from different colleges or universities of a
12 constituent unit to a college or university of another constituent unit,
13 (2) the status or completion of common course numbering within the
14 community-technical college system, and (3) the establishment of a
15 common passing score for any student placement test used within or

16 across the constituents units. Not later than January 1, 2008, the
17 Commissioner of Higher Education shall report the findings to the
18 joint standing committee of the General Assembly having cognizance
19 of matters relating to higher education and workforce advancement in
20 accordance with the provisions of section 11-4a of the general statutes.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:		
Section	<i>July 1, 2007</i>	New section

Statement of Purpose:

To require a study of the transfer and articulation agreements of the public institutions of higher education.
