AN ACT CONCERNING A COST OF LIVING INCREASE FOR PRIVATE PROVIDERS OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (Effective July 1, 2007) The sum of ___ dollars is
2 appropriated to the Office of Policy and Management, from the
3 General Fund, for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2008, to increase the
4 compensation rate paid to private providers of health and human
5 services under contract with the Departments of Social Services,
6 Children and Families, Mental Health and Addiction Services, Mental
7 Retardation, Public Health, Education and the Labor and Judicial
8 Departments by not less than seven per cent of the contracted rate in
9 effect for such providers on June 30, 2007.

10 Sec. 2. (Effective July 1, 2007) The sum of ___ dollars is appropriated
11 to the Office of Policy and Management, from the General Fund, for
12 the fiscal year ending June 30, 2009, to increase the compensation rate
13 paid to private providers of health and human services under contract
14 with the Departments of Social Services, Children and Families, Mental
15 Health and Addiction Services, Mental Retardation, Public Health,
16 Education and the Labor and Judicial Departments by not less than

17 five per cent of the contracted rate in effect for such providers on June
18 30, 2008.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:

Statement of Purpose:

To enhance the quality and continuity of care afforded state residents by the private provider community by increasing compensation rates paid by the state to such private providers.
