"AN ACT REQUIRING A DISCLOSURE STATEMENT WHEN A STATE OR LOCAL GOVERNMENT AGENCY REQUESTS AN INDIVIDUAL'S SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER."

1 After the last section, add the following and renumber sections and
2 internal references accordingly:

3 "Sec. 501. Subsection (d) of section 10a-77 of the general statutes is
4 repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective July*
5 *1, 2007*):

6 (d) Said board of trustees shall waive the payment of tuition at any
7 of the regional community-technical colleges (1) for any dependent
8 child of a person whom the armed forces of the United States has
9 declared to be missing in action or to have been a prisoner of war
10 while serving in such armed forces after January 1, 1960, which child
11 has been accepted for admission to such institution and is a resident of
12 Connecticut at the time such child is accepted for admission to such

13 institution, (2) for any resident of the state who is a dependent child or
14 surviving spouse of (A) a person who was killed in action while
15 performing active military duty with the armed forces of the United
16 States on or after September 11, 2001, or (B) a person who died as a
17 result of accident or illness sustained while performing active military
18 duty with the armed forces of the United States on or after September
19 11, 2001, (3) for any veteran having served in time of war, as defined in
20 subsection (a) of section 27-103, or who served in either a combat or
21 combat support role in the invasion of Grenada, October 25, 1983, to
22 December 15, 1983, the invasion of Panama, December 20, 1989, to
23 January 31, 1990, or the peace-keeping mission in Lebanon, September
24 29, 1982, to March 30, 1984, who has been accepted for admission to
25 such institution and is domiciled in this state at the time such veteran
26 is accepted for admission to such institution, [(3)] (4) for any resident
27 of Connecticut sixty-two years of age or older, provided, at the end of
28 the regular registration period, there are enrolled in the course a
29 sufficient number of students other than those persons eligible for
30 wavers pursuant to this subdivision to offer the course in which such
31 person intends to enroll and there is space available in such course
32 after accommodating all such students, [(4)] (5) for any student
33 attending the Connecticut State Police Academy who is enrolled in a
34 law enforcement program at said academy offered in coordination
35 with a regional community-technical college which accredits courses
36 taken in such program, [(5)] (6) for any active member of the
37 Connecticut Army or Air National Guard who (A) has been certified
38 by the Adjutant General or such Adjutant General's designee as a
39 member in good standing of the guard, and (B) is enrolled or accepted
40 for admission to such institution on a full-time or part-time basis in an
41 undergraduate degree-granting program, [(6)] (7) for any dependent
42 child of a (A) police officer, as defined in section 7-294a, or
43 supernumerary or auxiliary police officer, (B) firefighter, as defined in
44 section 7-323j, or member of a volunteer fire company, (C) municipal
45 employee, or (D) state employee, as defined in section 5-154, killed in
46 the line of duty, [(7)] (8) for any resident of the state who is a
47 dependent child or surviving spouse of a specified terrorist victim who

48 was a resident of this state, and ~~[(8)]~~ (9) for any dependent child of a
49 resident of the state who was killed in a multivehicle crash at or near
50 the intersection of Routes 44 and 10 and Nod Road in Avon on July 29,
51 2005. If any person who receives a tuition waiver in accordance with
52 the provisions of this subsection also receives educational
53 reimbursement from an employer, such waiver shall be reduced by the
54 amount of such educational reimbursement. Veterans described in
55 subdivision ~~[(2)]~~ (3) of this subsection and members of the National
56 Guard described in subdivision ~~[(5)]~~ (6) of this subsection shall be
57 given the same status as students not receiving tuition waivers in
58 registering for courses at regional community-technical colleges.

70 for admission to such institution and is a resident of Connecticut at the
71 time such child is accepted for admission to such institution, (2) for
72 any resident of the state who is a dependent child or surviving spouse
73 of (A) a person who was killed in action while performing active
74 military duty with the armed forces of the United States on or after
75 September 11, 2001, or (B) a person who died as a result of accident or
76 illness sustained while performing active military duty with the armed
77 forces of the United States on or after September 11, 2001, (3) for any
78 veteran having served in time of war, as defined in subsection (a) of
79 section 27-103, or who served in either a combat or combat support
80 role in the invasion of Grenada, October 25, 1983, to December 15,
81 1983, the invasion of Panama, December 20, 1989, to January 31, 1990,

82 or the peace-keeping mission in Lebanon, September 29, 1982, to
83 March 30, 1984, who has been accepted for admission to such
84 institution and is domiciled in this state at the time such veteran is
85 accepted for admission to such institution, [(3)] (4) for any resident of
86 Connecticut sixty-two years of age or older who has been accepted for
87 admission to such institution, provided (A) such person is enrolled in a
88 degree-granting program, or (B) at the end of the regular registration

102 child of a (A) police officer, as defined in section 7-294a, or
103 supernumerary or auxiliary police officer, (B) firefighter, as defined in

136 result of accident or illness sustained while performing active military

140 combat support role in the invasion of Grenada, October 25, 1983, to
141 December 15, 1983, the invasion of Panama, December 20, 1989, to
142 January 31, 1990, or the peace-keeping mission in Lebanon, September

166 who was killed in a multivehicle crash at or near the intersection of
167 Routes 44 and 10 and Nod Road in Avon on July 29, 2005. If any
168 person who receives a tuition waiver in accordance with the provisions
169 of this subsection also receives educational reimbursement from an
170 employer, such waiver shall be reduced by the amount of such
171 educational reimbursement. Veterans described in subdivision [(2)] (3)
172 of this subsection and members of the National Guard described in
173 subdivision [(4)] (5) of this subsection shall be given the same status as
174 students not receiving tuition waivers in registering for courses at The
175 University of Connecticut. Notwithstanding the provisions of section
176 10a-30, as used in this subsection, "domiciled in this state" includes
177 domicile for less than one year."
