S.B. No. 1044(RAISED) AN ACT CONCERNING DISCRIMINATION

Distinguished Members of the Judiciary Committee; thank you for the opportunity to submit this written testimony in support of the essential civil liberties and individual rights of the citizens of the State of Connecticut. Civil rights are positive legal prerogatives; the right to equal treatment before the law.

Transgendered people face serious discrimination in the workplace, housing and public accommodations. All too frequently, transgendered people are fired the moment their employers learn of their background. They are often targeted as they try to find a place to live and are regularly asked to leave restaurants, hotels, stores, medical facilities and educational institutions.

No one should lose their job or be denied a place to live because of their gender identify or expression. I am pleased that the City of Stamford has been a leader in this State and indeed the Country, in its efforts to end discrimination wherever we find it.

In the words of Franklin Delano Roosevelt, the 33rd President of the United States, "we must scrupulously guard the civil rights and civil liberties of all citizens, whatever their background. We must remember that any injustice, any hatred is a wedge designed to attack our civilization." Therefore, I ask this Committee and the General Assembly to pass SB 1044 to make certain that all citizens of the State of Connecticut are free from discrimination.
