**"AN ACT CONCERNING THE EMERGENCY 9-1-1 SURCHARGE
AND MISUSE OF THE E 9-1-1 SYSTEM."**

1 After the last section, add the following and renumber sections and
2 internal references accordingly:

3 "Sec. 501. Subsection (b) of section 28-1b of the general statutes is
4 repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective from*
5 *passage*):

6 (b) The council shall consist of: (1) The Commissioner of Emergency
7 Management and Homeland Security; the Secretary of the Office of
8 Policy and Management; the Commissioner of Public Safety; the
9 Commissioner of Public Health; the Commissioner of Mental Health
10 and Addiction Services; the Commissioner of Environmental
11 Protection; the Commissioner of Public Works; the Commissioner of
12 Transportation; the Adjutant General of the Military Department; the
13 chairperson of the Department of Public Utility Control; the Chief
14 Information Officer, as defined in section 4d-1; the State Fire

15 Administrator; or their designees; and (2) the following members
16 appointed as follows; [not later than July 1, 2004:] Two municipal
17 police chiefs, one appointed by the speaker of the House of
18 Representatives and one appointed by the Governor; two municipal
19 fire chiefs, one appointed by the president pro tempore of the Senate
20 and one appointed by the Governor; one volunteer fire chief appointed
21 by the minority leader of the Senate; one representative of the
22 Connecticut Conference of Municipalities appointed by the majority
23 leader of the Senate; one representative of the Council of Small Towns
24 appointed by the minority leader of the House of Representatives;
25 [one] two local or regional [civil preparedness director] emergency
26 management directors, one appointed by the speaker of the House of
27 Representatives and one designated, not later than July 1, 2007, by the
28 president of the Connecticut Emergency Management Association; one
29 local or regional health director appointed by the president pro
30 tempore of the Senate; one emergency medical services professional
31 appointed by the Governor; one nonprofit hospital administrator
32 appointed by the majority leader of the House of Representatives; and
33 one manager or coordinator of 9-1-1 public safety answering points
34 appointed by the Governor. Each member appointed under this
35 subdivision shall serve for a term of three years [from July 1, 2004]
36 commencing on July 1 in the year of their appointment, or until a
37 qualified successor has been appointed to replace such member. No
38 member appointed under this subdivision shall receive any
39 compensation for such member's service on the council."
