AN ACT ESTABLISHING A SPORTS ADVISORY BOARD.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (NEW) (*Effective from passage*) (a) Not later than October 1,
2 2008, the executive director of the Connecticut Commission on Culture
3 and Tourism shall establish a Sports Advisory Board within the
4 commission that shall advise the executive director on the most
5 effective ways to utilize state resources to promote, attract and market
6 in-state professional and amateur sports and sporting events. Such
7 board shall also advise the executive director on ways to coordinate
8 the use of state-owned facilities in order to enhance sports-related
9 tourism in the state and develop methods for the dissemination of
10 information concerning in-state professional and amateur sports and
11 sporting events to residents of the state and the northeast.

12 (b) Such advisory board shall consist of one member from each of
13 the following entities: (1) The University of Connecticut's Athletic
14 Department; (2) the Connecticut State University System's Athletic
15 Department; (3) the XL Center; (4) Northland AEG; (5) the Traveler's

16 Championship Golf Tournament; (6) the Pilot Pen Tennis Tournament;
17 (7) the Special Olympics; (8) the Mohegan Sun Arena; (9) Foxwoods
18 Resort Casino; (10) Lime Rock Park Race Track; (11) the Arena at
19 Harbor Yard; (12) New Britain Stadium; (13) the Connecticut Marine
20 Trades Association; (14) the Office of Policy and Management; (15) the
21 Department of Economic and Community Development; (16) the
22 Capital City Economic Development Authority; (17) the Nutmeg State
23 Games; (18) the Connecticut Interscholastic Athletic Conference; (19)
24 Fairfield University; (20) Quinnipiac University; (21) Sacred Heart
25 University; (22) any other entity involved in sports or sporting events
26 that the executive director deems appropriate; (23) the Connecticut
27 State Golf Association; and (24) Dodd Stadium.

28 (c) The first meeting of the Sports Advisory Board shall convene not
29 later than November 15, 2008, and the advisory board shall meet not
30 less than once per calendar quarter thereafter. The advisory board shall
31 provide any recommendations of the advisory board to the executive
32 director not later than thirty days after any such meeting.

33 (d) The members of the advisory board may select a chairperson
34 from among its membership who shall be responsible for the
35 scheduling and conducting of any such meeting.

36 (e) The Connecticut Commission on Culture and Tourism shall
37 provide staff support to the board.

38 (f) Not later than thirty days prior to each regular session of the
39 General Assembly, the executive director of the Connecticut
40 Commission on Culture and Tourism shall submit a report to the joint
41 standing committee of the General Assembly having cognizance of
42 matters relating to commerce that includes information on the status of
43 the Sports Advisory Board's activities, the implementation of any
44 recommendations of such advisory board and any legislative
45 proposals related to such recommendations.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:

Explanation

The bill requires the executive director of the Connecticut Commission on Culture and Tourism (CCCT) to establish and provide staff support for a Sports Advisory Board. There is a potential cost to CCCT associated with providing staff and administrative support for the board.

House "A" and Senate "A" add to the list of entities whose members make up the Sports Advisory Board, and have no fiscal impact.

The Out Years

The annualized ongoing fiscal impact identified above would continue into the future subject to inflation.

OLR Bill Analysis**SB 553 (File 224 as amended by Senate "A" and House "A")******AN ACT ESTABLISHING A SPORTS ADVISORY BOARD.*****SUMMARY:**

This bill requires the Connecticut Commission on Culture and Tourism's (CCCT) executive director to appoint a Sports Advisory Board within CCCT to advise her about how to promote the state's sports industry. The members must include state officials and representatives of specified organizations that sponsor or conduct sporting events. The director may add more members. She must appoint the board, by October 1, 2008, and CCCT must provide the staff to support it.

The board must convene its first meeting by November 15, 2008 and meet at least quarterly thereafter. The board members may appoint a chairperson from among themselves whose duties include scheduling and conducting meetings. The director must report annually to the Commerce Committee on the board's activity. The report is due within 30 days before the legislature meets in regular session.

*Senate Amendment "A" adds the following organizations that must be represented on the board: Nutmeg State Games, Connecticut Interscholastic Athletic Conference, Fairfield University, Quinnipiac University, and Sacred Heart University.

*House Amendment "A" adds the Connecticut State Golf Association and Dodd Stadium to the list of organizations that must be represented on the board.

EFFECTIVE DATE: Upon passage

PURPOSE

The board must advise the director how to:

1. effectively use state resources to promote, attract, and market in-state professional and amateur sports and sporting events;
2. develop methods to coordinate the way information is disseminated in the state and the Northeast about in-state sports and sporting events; and
3. coordinate the use of state-owned facilities to enhance sports-related tourism in Connecticut.

The board must submit any recommendations on these topics to the director within 30 days after it meets.

COMPOSITION

The bill requires the director to appoint one representative each from:

1. the athletic departments of the University of Connecticut and the Connecticut State University System;
2. XL Center (formerly, the Hartford Civic Center);
3. Northland AEG (an LLC that manages sports facilities);
4. Traveler's Championship Golf Tournament;
5. Pilot Pen Tennis Tournament;
6. Special Olympics;
7. Mohegan Sun Arena;
8. Foxwoods Resort Casino;
9. Lime Rock Park Race Track;
10. Arena at Harbor Yard;

11. New Britain Stadium;
12. Connecticut Marine Trade Association;
13. Office of Policy and Management;
14. Department of Economic and Community Development;
15. Capital City Economic Development Authority;
16. Nutmeg State Games;
17. Connecticut Interscholastic Athletic Conference;
18. Fairfield University;
19. Quinnipiac University;
20. Sacred Heart University;
21. Connecticut State Golf Association; and
22. Dodd Stadium.

The director may also appoint additional members representing entities involved in sports or sporting events she deems appropriate.

ANNUAL REPORTS

The director must report annually to the Commerce Committee about the board. The report must include (1) the status of the board's activities, (2) any of the board's recommendations being implemented, and (3) any legislative recommendations.
