AN ACT CONCERNING TELECOMMUNICATIONS AND TECHNOLOGY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- 1 Section 1. (*Effective from passage*) Section 16-240 of the general
- 2 statutes is repealed.
