AN ACT CONCERNING HEALTH INSURANCE SUBSIDIES TO STATE MARSHALS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. Subdivision (2) of subsection (k) of section 5-259 of the
2 2008 supplement to the general statutes is repealed and the following
3 is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective July 1, 2008*):

4 (2) Effective December 1, 2000, any state marshal shall be allowed to
5 participate in the plan or plans procured by the Comptroller pursuant
6 to subsection (a) of this section. Such participation shall be voluntary
7 and the participant shall pay the full cost of the coverage under such
8 plan, except that on and after July 1, 2008, the State Marshal
9 Commission shall, within available appropriations, provide subsidies,
10 in a manner to be determined by said commission, to participants to
11 assist in payment of the cost of said coverage.

12 Sec. 2. (*Effective July 1, 2008*) The sum of \$1,500,000 is appropriated
13 to the State Marshal Commission, from the General Fund, for the fiscal
14 year ending June 30, 2009, for Other Expenses, to be used solely for
15 subsidies to state marshals participating in the group hospitalization

16 and medical and surgical insurance plan or plans procured by the
17 Comptroller pursuant to section 5-259 of the 2008 supplement to the
18 general statutes, pursuant to subsection (k) of said section, as amended
19 by this act.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:		
Section 1	<i>July 1, 2008</i>	5-259(k)(2)
Sec. 2	<i>July 1, 2008</i>	New section

Statement of Purpose:

To provide state-funded subsidies to State Marshals to assist them in purchasing health insurance through plans offered to state employees.
