AN ACT CONCERNING JUVENILE PROSECUTORS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (NEW) (*Effective July 1, 2008*) All juvenile prosecutorial
2 officials shall be appointed by the Criminal Justice Commission and be
3 subject to the provisions of sections 51-278, 51-278a, 51-278b and 51-
4 279c of the general statutes. Such juvenile prosecutorial officials shall
5 have the same jurisdiction as other prosecutorial officials under section
6 51-281 of the general statutes.

7 (b) Juvenile prosecutorial officials employed by the Division of
8 Criminal Justice on the effective date of this section shall be deemed to
9 have been appointed by the Criminal Justice Commission and have the
10 same jurisdiction as other prosecutorial officials under section 51-281
11 of the general statutes.

12 Sec. 2. (NEW) (*Effective July 1, 2008*) For the purposes of chapter 815t
13 of the general statutes, "juvenile prosecutor" means any prosecutorial
14 official appointed by the Criminal Justice Commission.

15 Sec. 3. (NEW) (*Effective July 1, 2008*) Whenever any provision of the

16 general statutes vests authority or responsibility for action in a juvenile
17 prosecutor, that action or responsibility may be exercised by any
18 prosecutorial official appointed by the Criminal Justice Commission.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
