**RESOLUTION CONVENING THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY IN SPECIAL  
SESSION ON JUNE 11, 2008.**

Resolved by this Assembly:

1        WHEREAS, the Secretary of the State has received valid notices  
2        from a majority of the members of each house of the General  
3        Assembly, as required under section 2-6 of the general statutes, stating  
4        that in their judgment it is necessary for the General Assembly to meet  
5        in special session, as provided in Article Third of the Amendments to  
6        the Constitution of Connecticut; and

7        WHEREAS, the Secretary of the State, in accordance with said  
8        section 2-6, has notified all members to meet in their respective  
9        chambers in the Capitol at 10 o'clock in the forenoon on June 11, 2008;  
10       and

11       WHEREAS, we, the members of this assembly, deem the convening  
12       of a special session necessary based on the following fact, to wit: The  
13       pending expiration of the higher basic municipal real estate

14 conveyance tax will result in a serious shortfall of revenues for  
15 municipalities; and

16 WHEREAS, we, the members of this assembly, believe that  
17 legislative action to extend the expiration date of the higher basic  
18 municipal real estate conveyance tax of one quarter of one per cent for  
19 two years, until July 1, 2010, should be considered prior to the next  
20 regular session.

21 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that we, the members of  
22 this assembly, find that the convening of the General Assembly in  
23 special session is necessary as of this date for consideration of such  
24 legislative action; and

25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that upon the adoption of this  
26 resolution by both houses of the General Assembly, said houses shall  
27 complete their organization and proceed to the consideration of such  
28 legislative action.
