**"AN ACT CONCERNING ELECTRICITY MARKET INCENTIVE REBATES."**

1 After the last section, add the following and renumber sections and  
2 internal references accordingly:

3 "Sec. 501. Section 20-340 of the 2008 supplement to the general  
4 statutes is repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof  
5 (*Effective from passage*):

6 The provisions of this chapter shall not apply to: (1) Persons  
7 employed by any federal, state or municipal agency; (2) employees of  
8 any public service company or certified telecommunications provider  
9 regulated by the Department of Public Utility Control or of any  
10 corporate affiliate of any such company or certified  
11 telecommunications when the work performed by such affiliate is on  
12 behalf of a public service company or certified telecommunications  
13 provider, but in either case only if the work performed is in connection  
14 with the rendition of public utility service or certified  
15 telecommunications provider, including the installation or

16 maintenance of wire for community antenna television service, or is in  
17 connection with the installation or maintenance of wire or telephone  
18 sets for single-line telephone service located inside the premises of a  
19 consumer; (3) employees of any municipal corporation specially  
20 chartered by this state; (4) employees of any contractor while such  
21 contractor is performing electrical-line or emergency work for any  
22 public service company or certified telecommunications provider; (5)  
23 persons engaged in the installation, maintenance, repair and service of  
24 electrical or other appliances of a size customarily used for domestic  
25 use where such installation commences at an outlet receptacle or  
26 connection previously installed by persons licensed to do the same and  
27 maintenance, repair and service is confined to the appliance itself and  
28 its internal operation; (6) employees of industrial firms whose main  
29 duties concern the maintenance of the electrical work, plumbing and  
30 piping work, solar thermal work, heating, piping, cooling work, sheet  
31 metal work, elevator installation, repair and maintenance work,  
32 automotive glass work or flat glass work of such firm on its own  
33 premises or on premises leased by it for its own use; (7) employees of  
34 industrial firms when such employees' main duties concern the  
35 fabrication of glass products or electrical, plumbing and piping, fire  
36 protection sprinkler systems, solar, heating, piping, cooling, chemical  
37 piping, sheet metal or elevator installation, repair and maintenance  
38 equipment used in the production of goods sold by industrial firms,  
39 except for products, electrical, plumbing and piping systems and  
40 repair and maintenance equipment used directly in the production of a  
41 product for human consumption; (8) persons performing work  
42 necessary to the manufacture or repair of any apparatus, appliances,  
43 fixtures, equipment or devices produced by it for sale or lease; (9)  
44 employees of stage and theatrical companies performing the operation,  
45 installation and maintenance of electrical equipment if such  
46 installation commences at an outlet receptacle or connection  
47 previously installed by persons licensed to make such installation; (10)  
48 employees of carnivals, circuses or similar transient amusement shows  
49 who install electrical work, provided such installation shall be subject  
50 to the approval of the State Fire Marshal prior to use as otherwise

51 provided by law and shall comply with applicable municipal  
52 ordinances and regulations; (11) persons engaged in the installation,  
53 maintenance, repair and service of glass or electrical, plumbing, fire  
54 protection sprinkler systems, solar, heating, piping, cooling and sheet  
55 metal equipment in and about single-family residences owned and  
56 occupied or to be occupied by such persons; provided any such  
57 installation, maintenance and repair shall be subject to inspection and  
58 approval by the building official of the municipality in which such  
59 residence is located and shall conform to the requirements of the State  
60 Building Code; (12) persons who install, maintain or repair glass in a  
61 motor vehicle owned or leased by such persons; (13) persons or entities  
62 holding themselves out to be retail sellers of glass products, but not  
63 such persons or entities that also engage in automotive glass work or  
64 flat glass work; (14) persons who install preglazed or preassembled  
65 windows or doors in residential or commercial buildings; (15) persons  
66 registered under chapter 400 who install safety-backed mirror  
67 products or repair or replace flat glass in sizes not greater than thirty  
68 square feet in residential buildings; (16) sheet metal work performed in  
69 residential buildings consisting of six units or less by new home  
70 construction contractors registered pursuant to chapter 399a, by home  
71 improvement contractors registered pursuant to chapter 400 or by  
72 persons licensed pursuant to this chapter, when such work is limited  
73 to exhaust systems installed for hoods and fans in kitchens and baths,  
74 clothes dryer exhaust systems, radon vent systems, fireplaces, fireplace  
75 flues, masonry chimneys or prefabricated metal chimneys rated by the  
76 Underwriter's Laboratory or installation of stand-alone appliances  
77 including wood, pellet or other stand-alone stoves that are installed in  
78 residential buildings by such contractors or persons; and (17)  
79 employees of or any contractor employed by and under the direction  
80 of a properly licensed solar contractor, performing work limited to the  
81 hoisting, placement and anchoring of solar collectors, photovoltaic  
82 panels, towers or turbines."
