CCM is Connecticut's statewide association of towns and cities and the voice of local governments - your partners in governing Connecticut. Our members represent over 93% of Connecticut's population. We appreciate this opportunity to testify before this committee on issues of concern to towns and cities.

CCM supports H.B. 6304, "An Act Concerning Municipal Electric Costs".

This bill would allow municipalities and school districts to receive electric generation services through standard service rather than the more expensive SOLR.

The cost of electricity in Connecticut has gone up almost 60% in Connecticut since 1999.^[1] Towns and cities across the state have been struggling to keep up with rising energy costs.

Standard service would not be a panacea for high energy costs, but it would provide savings to local governments and their property taxpayers. There is no reason that government entities should find themselves in the more expensive SOLR category.

CCM urges you to favorably report this bill as a significant and positive step towards lowering municipal energy costs.
