The Committee on Judiciary reported through REP. LAWLOR of the 99th Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the House, that the bill ought to pass.

AN ACT CONCERNING PAROLE AND PROBATION TRANSPARENCY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- 1 Section 1. (NEW) (*Effective October 1, 2009*) The Department of
2 Correction shall notify the police chief and chief elected official of a
3 municipality every thirty days of the names and addresses of the
4 persons, if any, released from confinement in a correctional facility into
5 that municipality on probation or parole or pursuant to any other
6 community release program within the previous thirty days and the
7 support and assistance that is being provided to such persons to
8 facilitate their reentry into the community.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:

***AN ACT CONCERNING PAROLE AND PROBATION

SUMMARY:

This bill requires the Department of Correction to notify police chiefs and municipal chief elected officials every 30 days of the (1) name and address of inmates released into their communities on probation or parole or into a community release program within the previous 30 days and (2) support and assistance the offenders are receiving to facilitate their reentry into the community.
