The Committee on Planning and Development reported through REP. SHARKEY of the 88th Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the House, that the substitute bill ought to pass.

***AN ACT CONCERNING BONDS OF THE STATE FOR
REHABILITATION OF HOMES IN THE NEWHALL NEIGHBORHOOD
OF THE TOWN OF HAMDEN.***

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. Subdivision (33) of subsection (f) of section 13 of public
2 act 07-7 of the June special session is repealed and the following is
3 substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective from passage*):

4 (33) Purchase, rehabilitation or demolition of severely structurally
5 damaged homes caused by historic fill within the Newhall
6 neighborhood in Hamden, or for a grant-in-aid to the [town of]
7 Hamden Economic Development Corporation to fund the reasonable
8 costs related to the purchase, rehabilitation or demolition of the
9 severely structurally damaged homes caused by historic fill within the
10 Newhall neighborhood, not exceeding \$2,000,000.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:		
Section 1	<i>from passage</i>	PA 07-7 of the June Sp. Sess., Sec. 13(f)

This bill makes the Hamden Economic Development Corporation, rather than the town of Hamden, eligible for a Department of Economic and Community Development (DECD) grant of up to \$2 million to fund the reasonable costs related to the purchase, rehabilitation, or demolition of homes severely and structurally damaged by historic fill within the town's Newhall neighborhood. By law, DECD can use this funding itself for these purposes.
