House Bill No. 6669

*House of Representatives, April 20, 2009*

The Committee on Judiciary reported through REP. LAWLOR of the 99th Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the House, that the bill ought to pass.

## ***AN ACT CONCERNING SEXUAL OFFENDER REGISTRATION AND NOTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS.***

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (*Effective from passage*) (a) The Risk Assessment Board  
2 established under section 54-259a of the general statutes shall (1) make  
3 recommendations for establishing a process that would require  
4 persons convicted of a felony offense who are determined to be at risk  
5 of reoffending to register as a sexual offender under chapter 969 of the  
6 general statutes based on the nature and circumstances of the criminal  
7 incident and such person's prior offense history notwithstanding that  
8 the offense that such person stands convicted of does not require such  
9 registration, and (2) review any legislative revisions to the Adam  
10 Walsh Child Protection and Safety Act of 2006, P.L. 109-248, that may  
11 be adopted by the United States Congress and make recommendations  
12 with respect to actions that this state should take in order to be in  
13 compliance with the requirements of such revised act and establish an  
14 effective sexual offender registration and notification system.

15 (b) Not later than February 3, 2010, the board shall report its  
16 recommendations to the joint standing committee of the General  
17 Assembly on the judiciary in accordance with the provisions of section  
18 11-4a of the general statutes.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
