The Committee on Energy and Technology reported through SEN. FONFARA, J. of the 1st Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the Senate, that the bill ought to pass.

AN ACT CONCERNING TECHNOLOGY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- 1 Section 1. (*Effective July 1, 2009*) The Department of Public Utility
2 Control shall initiate a docket to develop Connecticut-based renewable
3 technologies. The department shall report, in accordance with the
4 provisions of section 11-4a of the general statutes, the findings of such
5 docket to the joint standing committee of the General Assembly having
6 cognizance of matters relating to technology on or before February 1,
7 2010.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
