Substitute Senate Bill No. 1149

Senate, April 15, 2009

The Committee on Government Administration and Elections reported through SEN. SLOSSBERG of the 14th Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the Senate, that the substitute bill ought to pass.

AN ACT CONCERNING THE REDUCTION OF CERTAIN DUPLICATE REPORTS BY THE DEPARTMENT OF INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. Section 4d-11 of the general statutes is repealed and the
2 following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective July 1, 2009*):

3 The Chief Information Officer shall establish a procedure for the
4 preparation by state agencies of plans and estimates of expenditure
5 requirements for information and telecommunication systems, for
6 consideration for inclusion in the Governor's budget document. [On
7 February 1, 1998, and annually thereafter, the Chief Information
8 Officer shall submit to the Secretary of the Office of Policy and
9 Management a report which sets forth the appropriation to each state
10 agency, for the fiscal year in progress, for information and
11 telecommunication systems and the actual expenditures for such
12 systems by each such agency as of December thirty-first of such fiscal
13 year. On August 1, 1997, and annually thereafter, the Chief

14 Information Officer shall submit to the secretary such report with
 15 respect to the last completed fiscal year.] On August 1, 2009, and
 16 annually thereafter, the Chief Information Officer shall submit to the
 17 Secretary of the Office of Policy and Management a report which sets
 18 forth the actual expenditures of each state agency for the last
 19 completed fiscal year for information and telecommunications
 20 systems.

21 Sec. 2. Section 4d-83 of the general statutes is repealed and the
 22 following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective October 1, 2009*):

23 [(a)] The Department of Information Technology, in consultation
 24 with the Department of Education, shall provide (1) technical
 25 assistance to local and regional boards of education and regional
 26 vocational-technical schools to expand their educational technology
 27 capabilities, including, but not limited to, wiring, Internet connectivity
 28 and technical support, and (2) opportunities for such boards of
 29 education and schools to purchase under state-wide contracts.

30 [(b)] The department shall report, annually, in accordance with
 31 section 11-4a, to the joint standing committee of the General Assembly
 32 having cognizance of matters relating to education on the assistance
 33 provided pursuant to subsection (a) of this section.]

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:

Sec. 2	<i>October 1, 2009</i>	4d-83

Statement of Legislative Commissioners:

Removed "and the actual expenditures for such systems by each such agency as of June thirtieth of the current fiscal year" from section 1 to prevent redundancy and to comply with the intent of the committee.

OLR Bill Analysis**sSB 1149*****AN ACT CONCERNING THE REDUCTION OF CERTAIN
DUPLICATE REPORTS BY THE DEPARTMENT OF INFORMATION
TECHNOLOGY.*****SUMMARY:**

This bill reduces by half the number of reports the Department of Information and Technology (DOIT) must provide to the Office of Policy and Management on state agencies information technology expenditures. Beginning August 1, 2009, DOIT must annually report on each agency's actual expenditures for the last completed fiscal year. Currently, DOIT reports agency appropriations and actual expenditures as of December 31 of the current fiscal year annually on February 1 and the same information with respect to the last completed fiscal year annually on August 1.

The bill eliminates the requirement for DOIT to report annually to the Education Committee on the technical assistance it provides to local, regional, and regional vocational-technical schools.
