### VOTE "NO" TO H.B. NO. 6350

The farm sales and use tax And the fuel tax exemptions are critical to todays' farmers. With rising prices in all our supplies, we have a very small margin of profit in the past few years. Most farms are family owned and run and support more than one generation. By taking away our exemptions on the sales tax and fuel exemptions, our profits will diminish even more and hinder our growth.

Without incentives to expand and buy new equipment and trucks for transport, our farms will decay and become obsolete. Then we will be forced with the grim reality of having to sell our farms. This in turn will create a snowball affect for Connecticut:

1. Without farmers making new purchases, jobs that make our trucks and equipment and buildings will be lost, which in turn will add to the already large unemployment list.
2. If a farmer needs to sell out who will plant all the vegetables and crops that are used by Connecticut families that support "locally grown" products. They will have to start supporting other states by buying out of state produce at higher prices. Does this make any sense?? NO!
