AN ACT CONCERNING A DEDUCTION FROM THE STATE INCOME TAX FOR MEDICAL AND DENTAL EXPENSES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- 1 That chapter 229 of the general statutes be amended to provide a
- 2 deduction from the state personal income tax for qualified medical and
- 3 dental expenses in excess of seven and one-half per cent of the filer's
- 4 federal adjusted gross income.

Statement of Purpose:

To allow taxpayers to deduct their eligible, unreimbursed medical and dental expenses from their state income tax as they are allowed on their federal returns.
