AN ACT CONCERNING THE REDUCTION OF CERTAIN DUPLICATE REPORTS BY THE DEPARTMENT OF INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. Section 4d-11 of the general statutes is repealed and the
2 following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective July 1, 2009*):

3 The Chief Information Officer shall establish a procedure for the
4 preparation by state agencies of plans and estimates of expenditure
5 requirements for information and telecommunication systems, for
6 consideration for inclusion in the Governor's budget document. [On
7 February 1, 1998, and annually thereafter, the Chief Information
8 Officer shall submit to the Secretary of the Office of Policy and
9 Management a report which sets forth the appropriation to each state
10 agency, for the fiscal year in progress, for information and
11 telecommunication systems and the actual expenditures for such
12 systems by each such agency as of December thirty-first of such fiscal
13 year. On August 1, 1997, and annually thereafter, the Chief
14 Information Officer shall submit to the secretary such report with
15 respect to the last completed fiscal year.] On August 1, 2009, and

16 annually thereafter, the Chief Information Officer shall submit to the
17 Secretary of the Office of Policy and Management a report which sets
18 forth the actual expenditures of each state agency for the last
19 completed fiscal year for information and telecommunication systems
20 and the actual expenditures for such systems by each such agency as of
21 June thirtieth of the current fiscal year.

22 Sec. 2. Section 4d-83 of the general statutes is repealed and the
23 following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective October 1, 2009*):

24 [(a)] The Department of Information Technology, in consultation
25 with the Department of Education, shall provide (1) technical
26 assistance to local and regional boards of education and regional
27 vocational-technical schools to expand their educational technology
28 capabilities, including, but not limited to, wiring, Internet connectivity
29 and technical support, and (2) opportunities for such boards of
30 education and schools to purchase under state-wide contracts.

31 [(b) The department shall report, annually, in accordance with
32 section 11-4a, to the joint standing committee of the General Assembly
33 having cognizance of matters relating to education on the assistance
34 provided pursuant to subsection (a) of this section.]

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
