97 (n) Funds appropriated to the Miscellaneous Appropriations  
98 Administered by the Comptroller in subsection (a) of this section, for  
99 the Reimbursement to Towns for Loss of Taxes on State Property, shall  
100 not lapse on June 30, 2007, and shall continue to be available for  
101 expenditure for such purpose as follows: The sum of \$6,999,929 shall  
102 be available during the fiscal year ending June 30, 2008; the sum of  
103 \$6,999,929 shall be available during the fiscal year ending June 30,  
104 2009.

105 (o) Funds appropriated to the Miscellaneous Appropriations  
106 Administered by the Comptroller in subsection (a) of this section, for  
107 Grants to Towns, shall not lapse on June 30, 2007, and shall continue to  
108 be available for expenditure for such purpose as follows: The sum of  
109 \$6,748,519 shall be available during the fiscal year ending June 30,

110 2008; the sum of \$6,748,519 shall be available during the fiscal year  
111 ending June 30, 2009.

112 (p) Funds appropriated to the Miscellaneous Appropriations  
113 Administered by the Comptroller in subsection (a) of this section, for  
114 the Reimbursement to Towns for Loss of Taxes on Private Tax-Exempt  
115 Property, shall not lapse on June 30, 2007, and shall continue to be  
116 available for expenditure for such purpose as follows: The sum of  
117 \$6,998,519 shall be available during the fiscal year ending June 30,  
118 2008; the sum of \$6,998,519 shall be available during the fiscal year  
119 ending June 30, 2009.

120 (q) Funds appropriated to the State Comptroller - Fringe Benefits in  
121 subsection (a) of this section, for State Employee Health Service Cost,  
122 shall not lapse on June 30, 2007, and shall continue to be available for  
123 expenditure for such purpose as follows: The sum of \$4,000,000 shall  
124 be available during the fiscal year ending June 30, 2009."

125 After the last section, add the following and renumber sections and  
126 internal references accordingly:

127 "Sec. 501. (*Effective from passage*) There shall be a Retirement  
128 Incentive Program (RIP) offered to full-time state employees, as  
129 described in this section, in addition to the normal retirement program.

130 A. Eligibility Rules.

131 The following members of the State Employees Retirement System  
132 (SERS) shall be eligible to participate in the program:

133 1. All state employees who will be at least fifty-five years of age on  
134 or before March 31, 2009, and who retire directly from employment  
135 and begin immediately receiving normal or early retirement benefits  
136 under Tier I, Tier II or Tier IIA and whose effective date of retirement  
137 is no later than April 1, 2009;

138 2. Who have at least ten years of actual, credited state service in the  
139 SERS, which shall consist of time worked and may not include

140 purchased service credits or credits transferred from another  
141 employer;

142 3. Who are on active status on the payroll as of March 31, 2009; and

143 4. Who are not employees of state aided institutions as defined in  
144 section 5-175 of the general statutes, quasi-public agencies, operators of  
145 vending stands covered by section 5-175a of the general statutes,  
146 teachers at E.O. Smith School, elected officials or employees of the  
147 United States Purchasing and Finance Office.

148 B. Effective Date of Retirement.

149 All retirements under the program shall be effective not later than  
150 April 1, 2009. At the state's option, the effective date of any retirement  
151 may be deferred on a case by case basis to not later than July 1, 2009,  
152 for instructional faculty of the vocational-technical school system or  
153 like educational settings designated by the state. In such cases, the  
154 extended service shall be credited.

155 C. Incentive.

156 An individual who is eligible for the RIP shall be permitted to add  
157 up to three years to service under SERS. Additional years of service  
158 granted under this section shall not be deemed service for any other  
159 purpose.

160 D. Restrictions.

161 1. For purposes of this program, a full-time employee is one who  
162 works thirty-five or more hours per week.

163 2. Actual paid wages, not projected wages, shall be used in all  
164 benefit calculations. Accrued vacation days at the date of retirement  
165 shall be credited in accordance with current practice.

166 3. Disability retirement and employees eligible for terminated  
167 vested retirement benefits are excluded from this program.

168 E. Payment for Unused Sick and Vacation Days.

169 1. Any employee participating in the incentive program shall be  
170 eligible for payment of accrued sick days and for the balance of  
171 vacation leave in accordance with existing rules, modified as follows:  
172 One-third of the amount owed such employee on July 1, 2012; one-  
173 third of such amount on July 1, 2013, and one-third of such amount on  
174 July 1, 2014.

175 2. The state may, at its option, make the payment in one installment  
176 on or before July 2012, if the amount of the payment is less than \$  
177 2,000.

178 F. Deferral of effective date

179 Notwithstanding the provisions of this section, the effective date of  
180 retirement pursuant to this section may be deferred on a case by case  
181 basis for: (1) Employees of the Office of the State Comptroller within  
182 the Retirement and Benefits Services Division who have responsibility  
183 for benefit calculations, as determined by the Comptroller, to not later  
184 than June 1, 2010; (2) upon the request of the personnel policies  
185 subcommittee of the Joint Committee on Legislative Management,  
186 employees of said committee determined to be critical to the legislative  
187 process, to not later than September 1, 2009 and (3) with the approval  
188 of the secretary of the office of policy and management, employees of  
189 said office determined to be critical to the legislative or budgetary  
190 process, to not later than September 1, 2009.

191 Sec. 502. (*Effective from passage*) All nonessential state employees  
192 shall take eight unpaid furlough days from March 2009 to June 2009,  
193 inclusive.

194 Sec. 503. (*Effective from passage*) (a) Notwithstanding the provisions  
195 of section 2-8 of the general statutes, for the fiscal years ending June 30,  
196 2009, to June 30, 2011, inclusive, the members and officers of the  
197 General Assembly shall receive salaries that are ten per cent less than  
198 the salaries specified in said section.

199       Sec. 504. (*Effective from passage*) (a) Notwithstanding the provisions  
200 of section 2-15 of the general statutes, no member of the General  
201 Assembly shall receive any transportation allowance during the fiscal  
202 year ending June 30, 2009.

203       (b) No member of the General Assembly or legislative employee  
204 shall receive payment from the state for any expenses associated with  
205 or resulting from attendance at any conference or other meeting in this  
206 state or another state or for any other travel related expense during the  
207 fiscal year ending June 30, 2009.

208       Sec. 505. (*Effective from passage*) Notwithstanding the provisions of  
209 section 2-15a of the general statutes, no member of the General  
210 Assembly shall be entitled to any unsolicited mailings at the expense  
211 of the state during the fiscal year ending June 30, 2009.

212       Sec. 506. (*Effective from passage*) (a) Notwithstanding the provisions  
213 of section 16-245m of the general statutes, the sum of \$6,000,000 shall  
214 be transferred from the energy conservation and load management  
215 account and credited to the General Fund for the fiscal year ending  
216 June 30, 2009.

217       (b) Notwithstanding the provisions of subparagraph (B) of  
218 subdivision (2) of subsection (c) of section 4-28e of the general statutes,  
219 the sum of \$3,000,000 shall be transferred from the Biomedical  
220 Research Trust Fund and credited to the General Fund for the fiscal  
221 year ending June 30, 2009.

222       (c) The sum of \$4,500,000 shall be transferred from the energy  
223 conservation projects account and credited to the General Fund for the  
224 fiscal year ending June 30, 2009.

225       Sec. 507. (NEW) (*Effective from passage*) There shall be paid to the  
226 Commissioner of Revenue Services by any retailer of tires commonly  
227 used on any motor vehicle a of three dollars on the sale at retail of any  
228 such tire. Any person engaged in the sale of such tires shall register  
229 with the commissioner on forms prescribed by the commissioner. Each

230 retailer of such tires subject to the tire fee as provided by this section  
231 shall submit a return quarterly to the commissioner, applicable with  
232 respect to the calendar quarter beginning April 1, 2009, and each

258       Sec. 508. (*Effective from passage*) All nonemergency dental services  
259 provided under the Department of Social Services' dental programs  
260 shall be subject to concurrent or retrospective review. Nonemergency  
261 services that may be exempted from the review process include  
262 diagnostic, prevention, basic restoration procedures and non-surgical  
263 extractions. The commissioner shall periodically, but not less than

264 quarterly, retrospectively review payments for emergency dental  
265 services for appropriateness of payment. The commissioner may  
266 recoup payments for services that are determined not to be for an
