"AN ACT CONCERNING TECHNICAL CHANGES TO MUNICIPAL STATUTES."

1 Strike everything after the enacting clause and substitute the
2 following in lieu thereof:

3 "Section 1. Section 14-313 of the general statutes is repealed and the
4 following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective October 1, 2009*):

5 Any person aggrieved by any order or regulation made by any
6 traffic authority under the provisions of this chapter, relating to the
7 establishment of through streets, the making of safety zones, the
8 establishment of parking restrictions or the location of loading and
9 unloading zones, or by the performance of any act pursuant to any
10 provision of this chapter, may take an appeal therefrom to the court of
11 common council or to the board of aldermen or board of
12 representatives of the city, to the town council or to the board of
13 selectmen or board of directors of the town, or to the warden and
14 burgesses of the borough, wherein such traffic authority is located, or
15 to the superior court for the judicial district in which it is located. Such

16 appeal shall be to the next session of such court or board which will
17 allow sufficient time for the service of the notice required herein. A
18 written notice of such appeal, addressed to such traffic authority, shall
19 be deposited with, or forwarded by registered or certified mail to, such
20 traffic authority at least ten days before the return day thereof. Upon
21 such hearing, such court or board shall determine whether the order or
22 regulation appealed from is reasonable, and shall thereupon sustain or
23 revoke such order or regulation. The court or board may, by
24 ordinance, delegate the authority to hear appeals under this section to
25 any agency, commission, board, department, employee or officer of
26 such city, town or borough other than the traffic authority or any
27 employee thereof."

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
