6 special session, section 3 of public act 08-1 of the November 24 special  
7 session, section 4 of public act 09-1 and section 1 of public act 09-2, are  
8 reduced by the following amounts for the fiscal year ending June 30,

10       Sec. 2. (*Effective from passage*) (a) The sum of \$11,000,000, exclusive of  
 11       assessments, shall be transferred from the Banking Fund, established

12 under section 36a-65 of the general statutes, and credited to the  
13 resources of the General Fund for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2009.

14 (b) The sum of \$6,492,122 shall be transferred from the resources of  
15 the Special Transportation Fund and credited to the resources of the  
16 General Fund for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2009.

17 (c) Notwithstanding the provisions of subparagraph (A) of  
18 subdivision (2) of subsection (c) of section 4-28e of the general statutes,  
19 the sum of \$10,000,000 shall be transferred from the Tobacco and  
20 Health Trust Fund and credited to the resources of the General Fund  
21 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2009.

22 (d) Notwithstanding the provisions of section 19a-73b of the general  
23 statutes, the sum of \$1,000,000 shall be transferred from the  
24 Connecticut Cancer Partnership Account and credited to the resources  
25 of the General Fund for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2009.

26 (e) The sum of \$81,596 shall be transferred from the Insurance  
27 Recoveries account, Military Department, and credited to resources of  
28 the General Fund for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2009.

29 (f) The sum of \$2,200,000 shall be transferred from the OPEB  
30 Teacher Fund and credited to the Retirees Health Service Cost account  
31 in the General Fund for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2009.

32 (g) The sum of \$2,845,450 appropriated to the Office of Policy and  
33 Management in subsection (a) of section 21 of public act 07-1 of the  
34 June special session, and carried forward under subsection (d) of said  
35 section, for Contingency Needs, shall be transferred and credited to the  
36 resources of the General Fund for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2009.

37 Sec. 3. Section 17b-265e of the general statutes is repealed and the  
38 following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective from passage*):

39 (a) There is established a fund to be known as the "Medicare Part D  
40 Supplemental Needs Fund" which shall be an account within the  
41 General Fund under the Department of Social Services. Moneys

42 available in said fund shall be utilized by the Department of Social  
43 Services to provide assistance to Medicare Part D beneficiaries who are  
44 enrolled in the ConnPACE program or who are full benefit dually  
45 eligible Medicare Part D beneficiaries, as defined in section 17b-265d,  
46 and whose medical needs require that they obtain nonformulary  
47 prescription drugs. A beneficiary requesting such assistance from the  
48 department shall be required to make a satisfactory showing of the  
49 medical necessity of obtaining such nonformulary prescription drug to  
50 the department. If the department, in consultation with the prescribing  
51 physician, determines that the prescription is medically necessary, the  
52 department shall cover the cost of the original prescription and any  
53 prescribed refills of the original prescription, less any applicable  
54 copayments. The department shall require as a condition of receiving  
55 such assistance that a beneficiary establish, to the satisfaction of the  
56 department, that the beneficiary has made good faith efforts to: (1)  
57 Enroll in a Medicare Part D plan recommended by the commissioner  
58 or the commissioner's agent; and (2) utilize the exception process  
59 established by the prescription drug plan in which the beneficiary is  
60 enrolled. The commissioner shall implement policies and procedures  
61 to administer the provisions of this section and to ensure that all  
62 requests for, and determinations made concerning assistance available  
63 pursuant to this section are expeditiously processed. The fund  
64 established pursuant to this subsection shall expire on July 1, 2009.

65 [(b) Assistance provided in accordance with the provisions of  
66 subsection (a) of this section shall be subject to available funds. All  
67 expenditures for prescription drugs under subsection (a) of this section  
68 shall be charged to the Medicare Part D Supplemental Needs Fund.

69 (c) The Department of Social Services shall, in accordance with the  
70 provisions of this section, pay claims for prescription drugs for  
71 Medicare Part D beneficiaries, who are also either Medicaid or  
72 ConnPACE recipients and who are denied coverage by the Medicare  
73 Part D plan in which such beneficiary is enrolled because a prescribed  
74 drug is not on the formulary utilized by such Medicare Part D plan.  
75 Payment shall initially be made by the department for a thirty-day

76 supply, subject to any applicable copayment.]

77 (b) Pharmaceutical manufacturers shall pay rebate amounts  
78 established pursuant to section 17b-491 to the department for  
79 prescriptions paid by the department pursuant to this section on or  
80 after January 1, 2007. The beneficiary shall appoint the commissioner  
81 as such beneficiary's representative for the purpose of appealing any  
82 denial of Medicare Part D benefits and for any other purpose allowed  
83 under [said act] federal law and deemed necessary by the  
84 commissioner.

85 [(d)] (c) Notwithstanding any provision of the general statutes, [not  
86 later than July 1, 2006,] the Commissioner of Social Services [shall  
87 implement a plan for pursuing] may pursue payment under Medicare  
88 Part D by Part D plans for prescriptions denied as nonformulary  
89 drugs, including remedies available through reconsideration by an  
90 independent review entity, review by an administrative law judge, the  
91 Medicare Appeals Council or Federal District Court. Reimbursement  
92 secured from the Medicare Part D plan shall be returned to the  
93 Department of Social Services.

94 [(e)] (d) The Department of Social Services, pursuant to subsection  
95 [(d)] (c) of this section, may authorize appeals beyond the independent  
96 review entity. [Upon determination by the department that it is not  
97 cost-effective to pursue further appeals, the department shall pay for  
98 the denied nonformulary drug for the remainder of the calendar year,  
99 provided the beneficiary remains enrolled in the Part D plan that  
100 denied coverage. Pending the outcome of the appeals process, the  
101 department shall continue to pay claims for the nonformulary drug  
102 denied by the Part D plan until the earlier of approval of such drug by  
103 the Part D plan or for the remainder of the calendar year.]

104 Sec. 4. Section 17b-257b of the general statutes is repealed and the  
105 following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective from passage*):

106 Qualified aliens, as defined in Section 431 of Public Law 104-193,  
107 admitted into the United States on or after August 22, 1996, other

108 lawfully residing immigrant aliens or aliens who formerly held the  
109 status of permanently residing under color of law who have been  
110 determined eligible for [Medicaid or for] state-administered general  
111 assistance medical aid prior to July 1, 1997, may be eligible for state-  
112 funded medical assistance which shall provide coverage to the same  
113 extent as [the Medicaid program,] state-administered general  
114 assistance medical aid, [or the HUSKY Plan, Part B] provided other  
115 conditions of eligibility are met. Such qualified aliens or lawfully  
116 residing immigrant aliens or aliens who formerly held the status of  
117 permanently residing under color of law who have not been  
118 determined eligible for [Medicaid or for] state-administered general  
119 assistance medical aid prior to July 1, 1997, shall be eligible for state-  
120 funded [assistance or the HUSKY Plan, Part B] under state-  
121 administered general assistance medical aid subsequent to six months  
122 from establishing residency in this state. Notwithstanding the  
123 provisions of this section, any qualified alien or other lawfully residing  
124 immigrant alien or alien who formerly held the status of permanently  
125 residing under color of law who is a victim of domestic violence or  
126 who has mental retardation shall be eligible for state-funded assistance  
127 [or the HUSKY Plan, Part B] under state-administered general  
128 assistance medical aid pursuant to this section if such applicant is  
129 otherwise eligible for such program. Only individuals who are not  
130 eligible for Medicaid or the HUSKY Plan, Part B under Title XXI of the  
131 Social Security Act shall be eligible for state-funded assistance under  
132 state-administered general assistance medical aid pursuant to this  
133 section.

150 Authority, and credited to the resources of the General Fund for the

153 Program account, Connecticut Student Loan Foundation, to the  
154 Department of Higher Education shall be transferred from said  
155 department and credited to the resources of the General Fund for the
