




Written Testimony for Appropriations Committee Public Hearing February 18, 2009

Solar Youth's mission is to provide opportunities for young people to develop a positive sense of self and connection and commitment to others through programs that incorporate environmental exploration, leadership and community service. There is a tremendous need for programs for Connecticut's urban youth that provide developmental supports and opportunities.

My name is Jasmine Webb. I'm 20 years old and I've been a part of Solar Youth since 2000 - as a participant, a staff person and a board member. 2006 was the first year we received funding through the State of Connecticut Department of Social Services. This funding was transformational as you can see on the chart in our testimony. In 2 years we more than doubled the number of youth enrolled in our programs to over 400. Solar Youth has been such a positive, consistent and reliable influence in my life and the life of my whole family - including my 4 siblings, 2 aunts, a cousin and a ton of friends. Right now my 2 sisters are in New Hampshire on a 4 day training retreat. Solar Youth is a program committed to teaching youth about the environment, but it also helped me develop my public-speaking skills, leadership ability, responsibility, dedication and hard work. Solar Youth has opened my eyes to me and the woman I can be. I not only learned about myself and nature, I learn about my community and how I can make a difference. We greatly encourage you to continue support our important work.

Nehemiah Watkins, 8th grade - Truman School

My name is Nehemiah Watkins. I live in the Westville Manor public housing development in New Haven. Before Solar Youth came to my community I was bad - I fought a lot, threw rocks at windows, and other stuff. When Solar Youth came, at first I said "I don't care and I'm not going."

Then one day my best friend convinced me to try it out. It has changed my life. It has helped me recognize what I am in the world for – like achieving my goals, getting a good education, and being a good citizen. I have also had many new experiences like outdoor adventures, helping the homeless, and growing food in a garden.
