Hello,

I am writing to strongly advocate for Section 5 of House Bill HB6666, which will allow for adjunct faculty certificates to be issued to the highly-trained professional artists, who serve as ECA's part-time faculty, to continue their 35-year record of preparing Connecticut's high school students. If they are required to become certified for 12-hour per week part-time positions, they will not be able to do so and the school will close. This will be a terrible loss to Connecticut's high school students in 19 school districts.

I was in the visual arts department in ECA from 1999 to 2002, where I learned skills and confidence that continue to help me in my current career. ECA helped me and countless other students a great deal in high school, providing a forum for young artists to hone their work and meet peers that have similar interests to them. ECA helped me choose what I wanted to study in college, and to give me the confidence to pursue a career in contemporary art.

After attending ECA, I received a BFA from Tufts University/The School of the Museum of Fine Arts, Boston. I currently live in San Francisco, CA and work in a fine art gallery as a gallery manager.
