
**AN ACT CONCERNING UTILITY DEPOSITS FOR BUSINESS
CUSTOMERS.**

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (*Effective from passage*) The Department of Public Utility
2 Control shall initiate a docket to examine the collection of deposits by
3 public service companies from any customer or prospective customer
4 other than a residential customer or prospective residential customer.
5 Such examination shall include, but not be limited to, consideration of
6 (1) a maximum deposit amount that public service companies may
7 collect from any customer or prospective customer other than a
8 residential customer or prospective residential customer, (2) criteria to
9 determine creditworthiness, (3) criteria for when the public service
10 company shall return the deposit plus interest, and (4) provisions for
11 collecting deposits from customers moving from one location to
12 another within the service area of the same company. On or before
13 February 1, 2010, the department shall report the results of such docket
14 to the joint standing committee of the General Assembly having
15 cognizance of matters relating to energy.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:

AN ACT CONCERNING UNLISTED TELEPHONE NUMBERS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (NEW) (*Effective October 1, 2009*) (a) No telephone
2 company, as defined in section 16-1 of the general statutes, shall charge
3 a fee for an unlisted telephone number to any customer who (1) has
4 obtained a standing criminal restraining order by the court against
5 another individual, and (2) qualifies for local, state or federal public
6 assistance.

7 (b) The Department of Public Utility Control shall adopt
8 regulations, in accordance with the provisions of chapter 54 of the
9 general statutes, establishing the procedure for waiving the fee
10 pursuant to subsection (a) of this section.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
