

DSS RECOMMENDED AMENDMENT: Amend ,Sec. A, Part I, A(2)(a) and Sec. A, Part II, A(2) as follows (deletions are in brackets and additions are preceeded by NEW):

,Sec. A, Part I, A(2)(a)

[MCOs are available statewide, however since Primary Care Case Management (PCCM) is initially being implemented as a pilot, it is not available statewide and is being limited to certain HUSKY A beneficiaries. To qualify for enrollment in PCCM, at least one family member must be a patient of a PCCM participating provider.]

NEW: It is the Department's intention to roll out the choice of PCCM as an option to the MCO model to other geographic areas within the State throughout the course of the two-year waiver period, with the intent of a calendar 2009 roll out, depending on the success of the pilot.

,Sec. A, Part II, A(2)

[Initially, the program is being piloted and limited to select primary care providers and their current enrollees who select PCCM. Based on efficacy and other factors the Department will evaluate the expansion of the program to individuals residing in other areas of the state.]

NEW: Initially, the program is being piloted with select primary care providers in Waterbury and the Willimantic/Mansfield area and their current enrollees who select PCCM. However, it is the Department's intention to roll out the choice of PCCM as an option to the MCO model to other geographic areas within the State throughout the course of the two-year waiver period, with the intent of a calendar 2009 roll out, depending on the success of the pilot.

NEW: * The 1:1200 PCCM-to-Enrollee ratio will be used throughout all the geographic areas as the PCCM program expands into additional parts of the State.

X Geographic mapping of provider network

[For PCCM, the Department has mapped the locations of applicant PCPs, and is only opening the program with providers in concentrated areas that have a mix of PCCMs available for both adults and children.]

NEW: For PCCM, the Department maps the locations of applicant PCPs and will use geo-mapping to ensure that geographic areas have a sufficient concentration mix of PCPs available for both adults and children before opening up the program in those areas.
