**"AN ACT CONCERNING THE PAYMENT OF PERSONAL SERVICE  
AND PURCHASE OF SERVICE CONTRACTS."**

1 After the last section, add the following and renumber sections and  
2 internal references accordingly:

3 "Sec. 501. (NEW) (*Effective July 1, 2009*) (a) Not later than September  
4 1, 2009, the Attorney General, within available appropriations, shall  
5 submit to the chairs and ranking members of the joint standing  
6 committees of the General Assembly having cognizance of matters  
7 relating to labor and government administration, the Governor and the  
8 Auditors of Public Accounts a report indicating the number of: (1)  
9 Matters referred by the Auditors of Public Accounts to the Attorney  
10 General, pursuant to section 4-61dd of the general statutes, during the  
11 last ten years, and (2) reports or complaints received from any other  
12 person involving alleged corruption, unethical practices, violation of  
13 state law or regulation, mismanagement, gross waste of funds, abuse  
14 of authority or danger to the public safety occurring in any state

15 department, agency, quasi- public agency or large state contract during  
16 the last ten years. For each such matter, report or complaint, the  
17 Attorney General's report shall indicate: (A) The general nature of the  
18 matter, report or complaint, (B) the scope of any investigation  
19 undertaken in response to such matter, report or complaint, (C) the  
20 findings of such investigation, and (D) whether the findings were  
21 reported to the Governor, the Chief State's Attorney or any other third  
22 party for further investigation or corrective action.

23 (b) On or before September first of each year following the issuance  
24 of the report described in subsection (a) of this section, the Attorney  
25 General, within available appropriations, shall submit an annual  
26 report updating the information provided in the report submitted  
27 pursuant to subsection (a) of this section. Such annual report shall  
28 provide an update of pending matters and contain the information  
29 described in subsection (a) of this section for any new matters, reports  
30 or complaints received by the Attorney General.

31 (c) Nothing in this section shall be deemed to require or authorize  
32 the Attorney General to disclose the identity of any person that  
33 provided information pursuant to section 4-61dd of the general  
34 statutes."
