**Environment Committee Public Hearing  
March 8, 2010**

**SUPPORT FOR  
Senate Bill 205 AN ACT CONCERNING ENHANCEMENTS TO THE INLAND  
WETLANDS AND WATERCOURSES ACT.**

The Council on Soil and Water Conservation (Council) strongly supports Senate Bill 205, An Act Concerning Enhancements to the Inland Wetlands and Watercourses Act and urges the Environment Committee's support.

SB 205 will strengthen the ability of Municipal Inland Wetland and Watercourse Commissions to protect local wetlands and watercourses without legal recourse and reduce the municipal economic burden associated with defending commission decisions.

Recent court decisions have placed an increasing legal burden on volunteer commissioners in reviewing and, if appropriate, denying a permit, even with extensive evidence indicating the proposed development would impact the wetland resources.

SB 205 clarifies the intent and purpose of the Act by stating that the applicant, not the town, must prove by a preponderance of evidence that the proposed activity will not negatively impact the wetland or watercourse, and that the municipal wetland agency can rely on comments and reports from state agencies such as the DEP and the Department of Public Health, as well as reports from Conservation Districts, the Environmental Review Team (ERT) and private environmental consultants.

Passage of this legislation is critical to the long term statewide protection of wetlands and watercourses.

The Council urges the Environment Committee to approve SB 205 to strengthen local ability to administer the Inland and Watercourses Act efficiently, economically and effectively.
