The Committee on Human Services reported through REP. WALKER of the 93rd Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the House, that the bill ought to pass.

AN ACT CONCERNING PURCHASE OF SERVICE CONTRACTS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (*Effective from passage*) Not later than July 1, 2010, the
2 Secretary of the Office of Policy and Management shall submit a
3 report, in accordance with the provisions of section 11-4a of the general
4 statutes, to the joint standing committee of the General Assembly
5 having cognizance of matters relating to human services concerning
6 purchase of service contracts. The report shall include (1)
7 recommendations for improving uniformity of the policies and
8 procedures of state agencies relating to purchase of service contracts,
9 and (2) a timeline for implementing recommended changes to the
10 agencies' policies and procedures. For purposes of this section,
11 "purchase of service contract" (A) means a contract between a state
12 agency and a private provider organization or municipality for the
13 purpose of obtaining direct health and human services for agency
14 clients and generally not for administrative or clerical services,
15 material goods, training or consulting services, and (B) does not

16 include a contract with an individual.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
