***AN ACT CONCERNING THE PRESERVATION AND CREATION OF JOBS IN CONNECTICUT.***

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 That the general statutes be amended to promote the preservation  
2 and creation of jobs in Connecticut in various ways, specifically  
3 including (1) refining the business entity tax under chapter 213a of the  
4 general statutes, and (2) funding such tax law change through a  
5 surcharge on bonuses received by high-level executives of companies  
6 that have received government assistance under the federal Troubled  
7 Asset Relief Program (TARP).
