**AN ACT IMPLEMENTING THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE
PROGRAM REVIEW AND INVESTIGATIONS COMMITTEE
CONCERNING TRANSFERRING ADULT EDUCATION PROGRAMS TO
THE COMMUNITY-TECHNICAL COLLEGE SYSTEM.**

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (*Effective from passage*) The Board of Trustees of the
2 Community-Technical Colleges, in consultation with the
3 Commissioners of Education and Higher Education and the
4 superintendent of the Connecticut Technical High School System, shall
5 examine the feasibility of transferring the adult education programs
6 currently administered by the State Board of Education, including, but
7 not limited to, the licensed practical nurse programs, to the
8 Community-Technical College System. Not later than October 1, 2010,
9 the Board of Trustees for the Community-Technical Colleges shall
10 report, in accordance with the provisions of section 11-4a of the general
11 statutes, to the joint standing committees of the General Assembly
12 having cognizance of matters relating to education and higher
13 education regarding the feasibility of transferring the adult education
14 programs, including the cost of such transfer, the number of
15 employees that would be impacted by such transfer and the

- 16 geographic locations of the regional community-technical colleges
17 where the adult education programs could be offered.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:

To implement the recommendations of the Program Review and Investigations Committee concerning an examination of the feasibility of transferring the adult education programs to the Community-Technical College System.
