**"AN ACT MANDATING THE REGIONALIZATION OF PUBLIC SAFETY EMERGENCY TELECOMMUNICATION CENTERS AND A STUDY OF CONSOLIDATION."**

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1 In line 22, after "2016," insert the following: "if such answering point  
2 is located in a municipality with a population of forty thousand or  
3 less,"

4 In line 66, strike "except as provided in subsection (d) of this  
5 section,"

6 In line 87, after "municipality" insert "with a population of forty  
7 thousand or less"

8 Strike subsection (a) of section 3 in its entirety and substitute the  
9 following in lieu thereof:

10 "Sec. 3. (*Effective from passage*) (a) The Office of State-Wide  
11 Emergency Telecommunications shall conduct a study to determine a

12 range of feasible arrangements of public safety answering points,  
13 including, but not limited to: (1) What number of answering points  
14 would achieve a balance between cost-effectiveness, operational  
15 efficiency and efficient use of new and existing resources; (2) which  
16 answering points could be consolidated, after considering cost,  
17 efficiencies, and natural or selected operational groupings; (3) what  
18 further consolidation of police, fire and emergency medical  
19 dispatching services and any related services is recommended; and (4)  
20 any and all costs associated with all aspects of and various options for  
21 consolidation, including municipal and state costs. Such study shall be  
22 paid for out of the Enhanced 9-1-1 Telecommunications Fund."
