PRIMARY CARE CASE MANAGEMENT PILOT PROGRAM."**

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- 1 In line 5, strike the opening and closing brackets and strike "and"
- 2 In line 17, strike the opening and closing brackets and strike "pilot
3 program"
- 4 Strike lines 25 to 33, inclusive, in their entirety and insert the
5 following in lieu thereof:
- 6 "(b) Not later than July 1, 2010, the Department of Social Services
7 shall implement, on a state-wide basis, a program for the delivery of
8 health care services through the primary care case management
9 system, as described in subsection (a) of this section to include all
10 enrollees in the HUSKY Plan, Part B and the Charter Oak Health Plan.
11 The Commissioner of Social"
- 12 In line 41, strike "pilot"
- 13 After line 41, insert the following:

14 "(d) Not later than July 1, 2010, the Commissioner of Social Services
15 shall secure administrative support services for the primary care case
16 management program, except the commissioner shall not enter into a
17 contract for the provision of such services with a provider of
18 comprehensive health care services as described in subsection (b) of
19 section 17b-266.

20 (e) Not later than July 1, 2010, the Commissioner of Social Services,
21 in consultation with service provider organizations, including, but not
22 limited to, the Connecticut State Medical Society and the Connecticut
23 Chapter of the American Academy of Pediatrics, shall develop a plan
24 to include additional providers as participants in the primary care case
25 management program.

26 (f) Notwithstanding the provisions of chapter 14, records
27 maintained by primary care case management providers shall not be
28 subject to public disclosure through any contracts with the
29 Commissioner of Social Services or with any organization with which
30 the commissioner contracts to administer the primary care case
31 management program."
