

CT's Own State Health Care Law
(Ready for Action in 2011)

The SustiNet Health Plan

- ☆ Streamlines state's health care spending
- ☆ Leverages state's purchasing power
- ☆ Controls costs and saves money
- ☆ Positions CT to attract new federal dollars



- ◆ Coverage will be paid for through employer and employee contributions and federal subsidies as eligible.
- ◆ Beginning in 2014, the SustiNet Health Plan will also be offered as an option in the new Health Insurance Exchange.
- ◆ In 2014, individuals may join SustiNet.

SustiNet Timeline

2011

○ **July 1, 2011**
Comptroller offers coverage under the state employee plan to municipalities and their retirees

○ **September 1, 2011**
Board of Directors of SustiNet Authority is named

2012

○ **January 1, 2012** (or earliest feasible date)
SustiNet offered to employees and retirees of non-state public employers; municipalities, small business and non-profit employers

State employees become part of SustiNet Plan

Medicaid, HUSKY Programs and Charter Oak Health Plan implement utilization management rules, health coordination, best medical practices, etc. established by SustiNet Authority

Expert is hired to determine existing state expenditures on health care funding for each of SustiNet funded groups

2014

○ **January 1, 2014**
SustiNet Authority offers coverage to individuals and employers in Connecticut. Individuals and families with income up to 200% of FPL, ineligible for Medicaid, become eligible for SustiNet
