**AN ACT ALLOWING POLICE OFFICERS TO APPLY FOR SECURITY SERVICE LICENSES.**

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. Subsection (a) of section 29-161h of the general statutes is  
2 repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective*  
3 *October 1, 2011*):

4 (a) The Commissioner of Public Safety may grant a security service  
5 license to any suitable person, or to any corporation, association or  
6 partnership subject to the following qualifications: The applicant for a  
7 license as a security service (1) shall be not less than twenty-five years  
8 of age and of good moral character, and (2) shall have had at least five  
9 years' experience in a supervisory management capacity in industrial  
10 security, or a supervisor within a federal or state security agency [ ] or  
11 [within a state or organized municipal police department or shall have  
12 had at least ten years' experience as] shall be a police officer with a  
13 state or organized municipal police department. If the applicant is a  
14 corporation, association or partnership, the person making the  
15 application shall be an officer of the corporation or a member of the  
16 association or partnership, and meet the foregoing qualifications.

17 Sec. 2. Section 29-161j of the general statutes is repealed. (*Effective*  
18 *October 1, 2011*)

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
