AN ACT CONCERNING THE INVESTIGATION OF MISSING PERSON REPORTS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 That chapters 104 and 528 of the general statutes be amended to
2 require that the state police and each municipal police department (1)
3 immediately accept any report of an adult missing person; (2) mandate
4 sensitivity training for all police officers; (3) issue to all police officers a
5 compact disc for use in any police car detailing a step-by-step
6 procedure to follow upon receipt of a report of a missing person; (4)
7 complete National Crime Information Center missing person reports
8 fully and timely; (5) train all new police officer recruits in the National
9 Missing and Unidentified Persons System; and (6) mandate collection
10 of DNA from homicide victims and from John or Jane Does who are in
11 a coma, have amnesia or have Alzheimer's disease.

Statement of Purpose:

To ensure that reports of missing persons are accepted and investigated by the police in an effective and timely manner.
