**AN ACT CONCERNING STATE FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE AND EMPLOYERS THAT HAVE TRANSFERRED JOBS OUT OF THE STATE.**

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (NEW) (*Effective October 1, 2011*) On and after October 1,  
2 2011, if the state or any agency of the state, including the Department  
3 of Economic and Community Development, the Connecticut  
4 Development Authority or Connecticut Innovations, Incorporated,  
5 provides financial assistance to any business organization with one  
6 hundred or more employees, such providing agency shall prohibit, as  
7 a condition to receiving financial assistance, the business organization  
8 from laying off, reassigning or transferring out of state fifty or more  
9 employees for the period during which the business organization  
10 receives such financial assistance. If the business organization lays off,  
11 reassigns or transfers out of state fifty or more employees in violation  
12 of this section, the full amount of any financial assistance received and  
13 a penalty of five per cent of such amount shall be repaid to the  
14 providing agency. For the purposes of this section, "financial  
15 assistance" includes, but is not limited to, all forms of loans, grants,  
16 guarantees and tax abatements.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:		
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Section 1	<i>October 1, 2011</i>	New section
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***Statement of Purpose:***

To penalize businesses with one hundred or more employees receiving financial assistance from the state that lay off, reassign or transfer out of state fifty or more employees while receiving said financial assistance.
