**"AN ACT PROMOTING ECONOMIC GROWTH AND JOB  
CREATION IN THE STATE."**

1 Strike section 17 in its entirety and insert the following in lieu  
2 thereof:

3 "Sec. 17. (NEW) (*Effective from passage*) Notwithstanding any  
4 provision of the general statutes, any municipality may, by ordinance,  
5 provide that any person, firm or corporation that owns a residence,  
6 building, structure, or other improvement to real property damaged or  
7 destroyed by acts of nature during the period beginning August 25,  
8 2011, and ending September 14, 2011, shall be allowed to reconstruct or  
9 repair such residence, building, structure or improvement in  
10 accordance with any previously approved permit or other  
11 authorization for the construction or repair of such residence, building,  
12 structure or improvement to the dimensions and specifications for  
13 such residence, building, structure or improvement prior to said

14 damage without seeking or obtaining additional approval from any  
15 municipal board or commission provided any such reconstructed or  
16 repaired residence, building, structure or other improvement complies  
17 with the state building, fire and health codes in effect as of the effective  
18 date of this section. Nothing in this section shall be construed to waive  
19 or eliminate the coastal site plan review requirements of chapter 444 of  
20 the general statutes, except that any ordinance enacted pursuant to this  
21 section may waive the coastal site plan review requirement for  
22 individual single-family residential structures, as provided in  
23 subdivision (4) of subsection (b) of section 22a-109 of the general  
24 statutes."
