**"AN ACT CONCERNING THE BUDGET FOR THE BIENNIUM  
ENDING JUNE 30, 2013."**

1 After the last section, add the following and renumber sections and  
2 internal references accordingly:

3 "Sec. 501. (*Effective from passage*) (a) Not later than three months after  
4 the effective date of this section, the Secretary of the Office of Policy  
5 and Management shall (1) develop a plan to reduce the manager and  
6 supervisor-to-employee ratio for agencies in the executive branch to  
7 not more than one manager or supervisor for every ten employees, and  
8 (2) report such plan, in accordance with the provisions of section 11-4a  
9 of the general statutes, to the joint standing committee of the General  
10 Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to government  
11 administration and elections and the Governor. The plan shall ensure  
12 that such ratio is achieved as a bottom-line number spread across all  
13 such agencies not later than nine months from the date of the  
14 completion of the plan.

15 (b) Not later than nine months after the reporting of such plan

16 under subsection (a) of this section, any executive branch agency that  
17 fails to comply with any goal established for such agency in such plan  
18 shall report the agency's reasons for lack of compliance, in accordance  
19 with the provisions of section 11-4a of the general statutes, to the  
20 Secretary of the Office of Policy and Management, the joint standing  
21 committee of the General Assembly having cognizance of matters  
22 relating to government administration and to the Governor.

23 (c) As used in this section, "executive branch agency" includes each  
24 "budgeted agency", as defined in subparagraph (A) of subdivision (11)  
25 of section 4-69 of the general statutes, except the offices of the Attorney  
26 General, State Treasurer, State Comptroller and Secretary of the State."
