**"AN ACT IMPLEMENTING PROVISIONS OF THE BUDGET
CONCERNING GENERAL GOVERNMENT."**

1 After the last section, add the following and renumber sections and
2 internal references accordingly:

3 "Sec. 501. Section 29-5 of the general statutes, as amended by section
4 168 of house bill 6650 of the current session, is repealed and the
5 following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective July 1, 2011*):

6 The Commissioner of Emergency Services and Public Protection
7 may, within available appropriations, appoint suitable persons from
8 the regular state police force as resident state policemen in addition to
9 the regular state police force to be employed and empowered as state
10 policemen in any town or two or more adjoining towns lacking an
11 organized police force, and such officers may be detailed by said
12 commissioner as resident state policemen for regular assignment to
13 such towns, provided each town shall pay sixty per cent of the cost of
14 compensation, maintenance and other expenses of the state policemen

15 detailed to such town, and on and after July 1, 2011, each town shall
16 pay seventy per cent of such regular cost and other expenses. [and one
17 hundred per cent of any overtime costs and such portion of fringe
18 benefits directly associated with such overtime costs.] Such town or
19 towns and the Commissioner of Emergency Services and Public
20 Protection are authorized to enter into agreements and contracts for
21 such police services, with the approval of the Attorney General, for
22 periods not exceeding two years. The Commissioner of Emergency
23 Services and Public Protection shall exercise such supervision and
24 direction over any resident policeman so appointed as such
25 commissioner deems necessary, and each appointee shall be required
26 to conform to the requirements of chapter 67. Each resident state
27 policeman shall have the same powers as officers of the regular state
28 police force and be entitled to the same rights and subject to the same
29 rules and regulations as the Division of State Police within the
30 Department of Emergency Services and Public Protection."
