"AN ACT IMPLEMENTING THE REVENUE ITEMS IN THE BUDGET AND MAKING BUDGET ADJUSTMENTS, DEFICIENCY APPROPRIATIONS, CERTAIN REVISIONS TO BILLS OF THE CURRENT SESSION AND MISCELLANEOUS CHANGES TO THE GENERAL STATUTES."

1 After the last section, add the following and renumber sections and
2 internal references accordingly:

3 "Sec. 501. Subsection (f) of section 10-262i of the general statutes, as
4 amended by section 190 of house bill 6651 of the current session, is
5 repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective July*
6 *1, 2011*):

7 (f) (1) For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2012, the budgeted
8 appropriation for education shall be not less than the budgeted
9 appropriation for education for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2011,
10 plus any reductions made pursuant to section 19 of public act 09-1 of
11 the June 19 special session, except that (A) for the fiscal year ending
12 June 30, 2012, any district with a number of resident students for the

13 school year commencing July 1, 2011, that is lower than such district's
14 number of resident students for the school year commencing July 1,
15 2010, may reduce such district's budgeted appropriation for education
16 by the difference in number of resident students for such school years
17 multiplied by three thousand, provided such reduction shall not
18 exceed one-half of one per cent of the district's budgeted appropriation
19 for education for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2011, and (B) for the
20 fiscal year ending June 30, 2012, any district that (i) does not maintain a
21 high school and pays tuition to another school district pursuant to
22 section 10-33 for resident students to attend high school in another
23 district, and (ii) the number of resident students attending high school
24 for such district for the school year commencing July 1, 2011, is lower
25 than such district's number of resident students attending high school
26 for the school year commencing July 1, 2010, may reduce such district's
27 budgeted appropriation for education by the difference in number of
28 resident students attending high school for such school years
29 multiplied by the tuition paid per student pursuant to section 10-33. A
30 town shall not be eligible to reduce its budgeted appropriation for
31 education pursuant to this subdivision if the school district for the
32 town is in its third year or more of being identified as in need of
33 improvement pursuant to section 10-223e, and (A) has failed to make
34 adequate yearly progress in mathematics or reading at the whole
35 district level, or (B) has satisfied the requirements for adequate yearly
36 progress in mathematics or reading pursuant to Section 1111(b)(2)(I) of
37 Subpart 1 of Part A of Title I of the No Child Left Behind Act, P.L. 107-
38 110, as amended from time to time.

39 (2) For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2013, the budgeted
40 appropriation for education shall be not less than the budgeted
41 appropriation for education for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2012,
42 except that (A) for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2013, any district
43 with a number of resident students for the school year commencing
44 July 1, 2012, that is lower than such district's number of resident
45 students for the school year commencing July 1, 2011, may reduce such
46 district's budgeted appropriation for education by the difference in

47 number of resident students for such school years multiplied by three
48 thousand, provided such reduction shall not exceed one-half of one
49 per cent of the district's budgeted appropriation for education for the
50 fiscal year ending June 30, 2012, and (B) for the fiscal year ending June
51 30, 2013, any district that (i) does not maintain a high school and pays
52 tuition to another school district pursuant to section 10-33 for resident
53 students to attend high school in another district, and (ii) the number
54 of resident students attending high school for such district for the
55 school year commencing July 1, 2012, is lower than such district's
56 number of resident students attending high school for the school year
57 commencing July 1, 2011, may reduce such district's budgeted
58 appropriation for education by the difference in number of resident
59 students attending high school for such school years multiplied by the
60 tuition paid per student pursuant to section 10-33. A town shall not be
61 eligible to reduce its budgeted appropriation for education pursuant to
62 this subdivision if the school district for the town is in its third year or
63 more of being identified as in need of improvement pursuant to
64 section 10-223e, and (A) has failed to make adequate yearly progress in
65 mathematics or reading at the whole district level, or (B) has satisfied
66 the requirements for adequate yearly progress in mathematics or
67 reading pursuant to Section 1111(b)(2)(I) of Subpart 1 of Part A of Title
68 I of the No Child Left Behind Act, P.L. 107-110, as amended from time
69 to time.

70 (3) Notwithstanding the provisions of subdivisions (1) and (2) of
71 this subsection, the Commissioner of Education may permit a district
72 to reduce its budgeted appropriation for education for the fiscal year
73 ending June 30, 2012, or June 30, 2013, in an amount determined by the
74 commissioner if such district has permanently ceased operations and
75 closed one or more schools in the district due to declining enrollment
76 at such closed school or schools in the fiscal year ending June 30, 2011,
77 June 30, 2012, or June 30, 2013."
