The Committee on Energy and Technology reported through REP. NARDELLO of the 89th Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the House, that the substitute bill ought to pass.

AN ACT CONCERNING ENERGY INFRASTRUCTURE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (*Effective July 1, 2012*) The Department of Energy and
2 Environmental Protection shall conduct a study to identify steps to
3 develop Connecticut-based renewable energy technologies. The
4 department shall report, in accordance with the provisions of section
5 11-4a of the general statutes, the findings of such study to the joint
6 standing committee of the General Assembly having cognizance of
7 matters relating to technology on or before February 1, 2013.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
