**AN ACT CONCERNING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A COLLEGE  
INTERN REGULATORY BOARD.**

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (*Effective from passage*) (a) On or before October 1, 2012, the  
2 president of the Board of Regents for Higher Education, in  
3 consultation with the executive director of the Office of Financial and  
4 Academic Affairs for Higher Education and the Labor Commissioner,  
5 or their designees, shall, within existing budgetary resources, develop  
6 a plan to create and implement a college intern regulatory board to  
7 regulate higher education student internship programs. Such plan  
8 shall also provide recommendations for the establishment of an  
9 administrative hearing board within the college intern regulatory  
10 board to accommodate any request for a hearing by a student  
11 pertaining to his or her internship.

12 (b) On or before January 1, 2013, the president of the Board of  
13 Regents for Higher Education shall report to the joint standing  
14 committees of the General Assembly having cognizance of matters  
15 relating to higher education and labor on the plan developed pursuant  
16 to subsection (a) of this section. Such report shall include the projected

17 cost of establishing a college intern regulatory board,  
18 recommendations for the establishment of an administrative hearing  
19 board within the college intern regulatory board, and  
20 recommendations for administrative or legislative action needed to  
21 implement the plan.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
