***AN ACT CONCERNING THE INCLUSION OF PERSONAL FINANCIAL
MANAGEMENT IN THE PUBLIC SCHOOL CURRICULUM.***

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. Subsection (a) of section 10-16b of the 2012 supplement to
2 the general statutes is repealed and the following is substituted in lieu
3 thereof (*Effective July 1, 2012*):

4 (a) In the public schools the program of instruction offered shall
5 include at least the following subject matter, as taught by legally
6 qualified teachers, the arts; career education; personal financial
7 management education; consumer education; health and safety,
8 including, but not limited to, human growth and development,
9 nutrition, first aid, disease prevention, community and consumer
10 health, physical, mental and emotional health, including youth suicide
11 prevention, substance abuse prevention, safety, which may include the
12 dangers of gang membership, and accident prevention; language arts,
13 including reading, writing, grammar, speaking and spelling;
14 mathematics; physical education; science; social studies, including, but
15 not limited to, citizenship, economics, geography, government and
16 history; and in addition, on at least the secondary level, one or more

17 world languages and vocational education. For purposes of this
18 subsection, world languages shall include American Sign Language,
19 provided such subject matter is taught by a qualified instructor under
20 the supervision of a teacher who holds a certificate issued by the State
21 Board of Education. For purposes of this subsection, the "arts" means
22 any form of visual or performing arts, which may include, but not be
23 limited to, dance, music, art and theatre.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:

To include personal financial management in the prescribed courses of study in the public school curriculum.
