Substitute Senate Bill No. 41

Senate, April 3, 2012

The Committee on Higher Education and Employment Advancement reported through SEN. BYE of the 5th Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the Senate, that the substitute bill ought to pass.

AN ACT CONCERNING WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (*Effective July 1, 2012*) The Office of Workforce
2 Competitiveness, in collaboration with the Department of Education
3 and the Board of Regents for Higher Education, shall study model
4 programs concerning the preemployment training and employment of
5 young adults with autism spectrum disorder and other developmental
6 disabilities. Not later than January 1, 2013, the Office of Workforce
7 Competitiveness shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 11-
8 4a of the general statutes, report on such study to the joint standing
9 committee of the General Assembly having cognizance of matters
10 relating to higher education and employment advancement.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:

Section 1	<i>July 1, 2012</i>	New section
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Statement of Legislative Commissioners:

A reference to section 11-4a of the general statutes was added for conformity with the statutes.
