**"AN ACT CONCERNING THE QUALIFICATIONS FOR CANDIDATES SEEKING ELECTION TO THE OFFICE OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL."**

1 Strike lines 1 to 12, inclusive, in their entirety and substitute the  
2 following in lieu thereof:

3 "Section 1. Section 3-124 of the general statutes is repealed and the  
4 following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective from passage*):

5 (a) There shall be an Attorney General to be elected in the same  
6 manner as other state officers in accordance with the provisions of  
7 section 9-181.

8 (b) The Attorney General shall be an elector of this state, [and] an  
9 attorney at law [of at least ten years' active practice at the bar of this  
10 state. The office of the Attorney General shall be at the Capitol.] who  
11 has been a member in good standing of the bar of this state for a  
12 continuous period of at least ten years immediately prior to taking  
13 office, and have full-time responsibility for providing or managing the

14 provision of legal services to individual or organizational clients for a  
15 continuous period of at least ten years immediately prior to taking  
16 office. No person possessing a record of any criminal conviction or  
17 who has been found guilty of misconduct by the State-Wide Grievance  
18 Committee shall be eligible for election to, or hold the office of,  
19 Attorney General.

20 (c) The Attorney General shall receive an annual salary of one  
21 hundred ten thousand dollars. The Attorney General shall devote full  
22 time to the duties of the office and shall give bond in the sum of ten  
23 thousand dollars."
