"AN ACT ALLOWING THE RETENTION OF AN ADMINISTRATIVE COST ALLOWANCE FROM THE CONNECTICUT INDEPENDENT COLLEGE STUDENT GRANT PROGRAM FOR COMPLIANCE AUDITS."

1 After the last section, add the following and renumber sections and
2 internal references accordingly:

3 "Sec. 501. (NEW) (*Effective July 1, 2012*) (a) On or before October 1,
4 2012, and annually thereafter, each institution of higher education shall
5 submit information to the Office of Financial and Academic Affairs for
6 Higher Education, in a form prescribed by the office, on each student
7 enrolled at such institution of higher education who received financial
8 assistance for the previous academic year ending on or before the
9 previous June thirtieth from the Connecticut independent student
10 grant program, administered pursuant to sections 10a-38 to 10a-42,
11 inclusive, of the general statutes, the Connecticut aid to public college
12 students grant program, administered pursuant to section 10a-164a of
13 the general statutes, or the capitol scholarship grant program,

14 administered pursuant to section 10a-169 of the general statutes,
 15 including, but not limited to, (1) each such student's year of birth,
 16 home town, cumulative grade point average, expected date of
 17 graduation, and expected family contribution toward educational costs
 18 as determined by a needs analysis system approved by the United
 19 States Department of Education, and (2) a detailed breakdown of the
 20 financial assistance each such student received from all sources.

21 (b) If an institution of higher education fails to submit information
 22 to the Office of Financial and Academic Affairs for Higher Education
 23 in accordance with subsection (a) of this section, such institution shall
 24 be prohibited from participating in the Connecticut independent
 25 student grant program, the Connecticut aid to public college students
 26 grant program, and the capitol scholarship grant program during the
 27 fiscal year following the fiscal year in which such institution of higher
 28 education failed to submit such information.

29 (c) The Office of Financial and Academic Affairs for Higher
 30 Education shall submit, as needed or requested, in accordance with the
 31 provisions of section 11-4a of the general statutes, a report regarding
 32 the information submitted in accordance with subsection (a) of this
 33 section to the joint standing committees of the General Assembly
 34 having cognizance of matters relating to higher education and
 35 appropriations."
