**"AN ACT CONCERNING THE ADMINISTRATION OF MEDICINE TO STUDENTS WITH DIABETES, THE DUTIES OF SCHOOL MEDICAL ADVISORS, THE INCLUSION OF CPR AND AED TRAINING IN THE PUBLIC SCHOOL CURRICULUM AND PHYSICAL EXERCISE DURING THE SCHOOL DAY."**

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- 1 In line 5, insert an opening bracket before "or"
  - 2 In line 6, insert a closing bracket after "nurse"
  - 3 In line 42, insert brackets around "subsection" and after the closing
  - 4 bracket insert "subsections"
  - 5 In line 42, after "(d)" insert "and (e)"
  - 6 Strike lines 135 to 149, inclusive, and insert the following in lieu
  - 7 thereof:
  - 8 "(e) (1) With the written authorization of a student's parent or

9 guardian, and (2) pursuant to a written order of the student's physician  
10 licensed under chapter 370, a school nurse and a school medical  
11 advisor shall select and provide general supervision to a qualified  
12 school employee to administer medication with injectable equipment  
13 used to administer glucagon to a student with diabetes that may  
14 require prompt treatment in order to protect the student against  
15 serious harm or death. Such authorization shall be limited to situations  
16 when the school nurse is absent. Such qualified school employee shall  
17 agree to assume the responsibilities under such authorization. Each  
18 such qualified school employee shall annually complete any training  
19 required by the school nurse and school medical advisor in the  
20 administration of medication with injectable equipment used to  
21 administer glucagon. No qualified school employee shall administer  
22 medication under this subsection unless the school nurse and school  
23 medical advisor has attested in writing that such qualified school  
24 employee has completed such training. For purposes of this  
25 subsection, "injectable equipment used to administer glucagon" means  
26 an injector or injectable equipment used to deliver glucagon in an  
27 appropriate dose for emergency first aid response to diabetes. For  
28 purposes of this subsection, "qualified school employee" means a  
29 principal, teacher, licensed athletic trainer, licensed physical or  
30 occupational therapist employed by a school district, coach or school  
31 paraprofessional."
